About todays' hymns

From All That Dwell Below the Skies is a metrical paraphrase of Psalm 117 by the great eighteenth century English hymn writer Isaac Watts. Watts is a pivotal figure in the history of hymnody in that prior to Watts hymnody in the Calvinist tradition was limited to the Psalms. Watts took the Psalms and clothed its language with the message of the New Testament. The tune *Lasst uns erfreuen* dates from the early seventeenth century and was originally composed for an Easter text.

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling was written by the great Methodist hymn writer Charles Wesley. Wesley was the eighteenth child of Samuel and Susanna Wesley. In 1735 he came to colonial Georgia as secretary to General Oglethorpe, having previously received both deacon's and priest's orders in the Church of England. On Pentecost 1738 he had a personal conversion and dedicated his life to the Methodist movement. He is known to have written more than 6,000 hymns. The tune is one of many fine Welsh tunes; its name comes from the Welsh words meaning "cheerful." It is interesting to note that with one exception the melody lies within the first five notes of the musical scale. The tune *Hyfrydol* is of Welsh origin; its name is pronounced huv-ro-dol, and is variously translated as "melodious, delightful, pleasant." It was composed by Rowland Hugh Prichard before his twentieth birthday. He was a gifted song leader and tune writer who was born and spent most of his life in Bala, Wales. Vocationally he was a loom tender with the Welsh Flannel Manufacturing Company.

About today's choral music

Teach Me Your Way, O Lord is based on verses from Psalm 86. Its composer, Mark Sedio, is Cantor (Director of Music) at Central Lutheran Church, Minneapolis, and also serves on the music staff of Luther Seminary, St. Paul, MN.

Pilgrims' Hymn is one of Stephen Paulus' most performed and beloved works. It is from his opera, *The Three Hermits*, which is based on a short story by Leo Tolstoy and premiered at the House of Hope Presbyterian Church, St. Paul, Minnesota, in April 1997. The text is by Michael Dennis Browne, a poet who wrote the texts for many of Stephen Paulus' works.
