

Welcome to worship. Welcome to the Kirk. Welcome home.

Here at the Kirk, our vision statement is *We envision a world where every heart experiences God's transforming love*. This statement was born from months of congregation-wide listening sessions and years of prayer and discernment. We are already seeing it take root.

We envision a world. In one of Jesus' most famous moments, he feeds the multitudes with five loaves and two fish. In another story, Jesus helps his frustrated disciples to secure a net full of fish by inviting them to cast their nets on the other side of the boat. They catch so many fish that there are too many to eat on their own! Ours is a church that hopes to look beyond our own needs to do what Jesus and the disciples did—share our fish with the world.



Where every heart experiences. Jesus reminds us in his birth, his ministry, and in his promise of the Holy Spirit, that God is near! Throughout the pages of the gospels, we see people following him to shorelines and meeting him there. Jesus was standing on the shore when he called his first disciples, Peter and Andrew. The **shore** is where the crowd listened to him preach and where the disciples met him after the resurrection. We hope to be a church that comes to shore to meet the living Christ! For us, this starts in worship. We hope through our worship, mission, and formation, we will have your eyes lighting up with the reminder of how you and how our community are made well (created), are being made well (healed), and will be made well (saved) into eternity.

About todays' hymns

Come Sing, O Church, in Joy was written by the Rev. Brian Dill in 1989 for the bicentennial for the Presbyterian Church. Dill was well-known as an engaging preacher and pastor, and served congregations in Illinois, Kentucky, Virginia, and Florida.

Go to the World was written in 1985 for the Convocation of Emmanuel College, Toronto, the largest theological school of the United Church of Canada and is based on the theme of the Great Commission found in Matthew 28: 19-20. The author, Sylvia Dunstan, was an ordained pastor in the United Church of Canada, served in her brief life (she died at the age of 38 from cancer) as a prison chaplain as well as in parish ministry, and was also a prolific hymn writer.

About today's choral music

Jubilate Deo is a setting of Psalm 100. The composer, Malcolm Archer, is an English composer, conductor, and organist, who served as Director of Music and Organist at Wells Cathedral, St. Paul's Cathedral (London), and Winchester College. The title, "Jubilate Deo," is Latin for "sing joyfully to God."

From All That Dwell Below the Skies is a setting of a metrical paraphrase of Psalm 117. The composer, Gordon Young, was Director of Music and Organist at First Presbyterian Church, Detroit for decades during the second half of the twentieth century, and also served on the faculty of Wayne State University, where he was professor of organ.

Today's Cover Art - *The Prodigal Son* © 2016 | John August Swanson | Used with permission, *Eyekons* John August Swanson writes, "The parable of the Prodigal Son has inspired many artists, musicians, writers, and poets. The story has many levels for interpretation and insight into the human experience, especially family life and forgiveness." This art is a serigraph. It is a complex work, with miniatures bordering a central group of larger images. He returned to the story and painted a second version twenty years later.



Art at the Kirk - The Return of the Prodigal, by N. C. Wyeth (1882-1945) is one of the six paintings by Wyeth which hang in the Kirk Refectory. Wyeth was a prominent American artist and illustrator; he created more than 3,000 paintings and illustrated 112 books. The Kirk paintings date from 1923, and were originally painted for the Unitarian Laymen's League. In 1931 they were included in the book, *The Parables of Jesus*, by S. Parker Cadman. Wyeth was a realist painter at a time when photography began to compete with his craft. His goal was to create works where feelings and emotions would be readily understood, as exemplified in this painting. He is the father of Andrew Wyeth and the grandfather of Jamie Wyeth, both well-known American painters.
