# Welcome to worship. Welcome to the Kirk. Welcome home.

# About todays' hymns

**Now All the Vault of Heaven Resounds** was written by Paul Z. Strodach, an American Lutheran pastor during the first half of the twentieth century who served parishes in New Jersey, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. He was also active as a translator, author of manuals on liturgical worship practices, and as a hymn book editor.

Lord, You Give the Great Commission was commissioned by the 1978 graduating class of Yale Divinity School and Berkley Divinity School for use at their baccalaureate service. Its author, Jeffrey Rowthorn, was a professor at these schools and also at the Yale Institute of Sacred Music, from 1973 to 1987, when he was elected a bishop in the Episcopal Church in Connecticut, which he served until 1994 when he became dean of the American Cathedral in Paris. The text is based on Matthew 10: 7-8, 28: 19, 26: 26-28; Luke 23: 34, and Matthew 28: 20.

# About today's choral music

**The introit** is a traditional German Easter hymn which evolved from an eleventh century Easter hymn traditionally sung before the reading of the Gospel lesson on Easter Day and throughout the Easter season.

**O Sons and Daughters** is a traditional French carol which dates from the late fifteenth century. The text is based on John 20: 19-29. The opening voluntary is a setting of this carol.

This Joyful Eastertide is a traditional Dutch carol with a text by George Woodward, a priest in the Church of England whose is best known for his many translations of Latin, Greek, and German hymn texts. The composer of this arrangement, Philip Ledger, had a wide-ranging career in the mid-twentieth century as a choir master and organist, most notably at King's College Chapel, Cambridge University, followed by a tenure as principal of the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama, in addition to composing many carol arrangements.

It is located in the Sistine Chapel, Rome. This work tells a story beginning with the calling of fishermen, Peter, Andrew, James and John (in background) and carries on in the foreground with Peter and Andrew kneeling and being blessed by Christ. Interestingly, many in the crowd are Florentine contemporaries of the artist.
