

We envision a world. In one of Jesus' most famous moments, he feeds the multitudes with five loaves and two fish. In another story, Jesus helps his frustrated disciples to secure a net full of fish by inviting them to cast their nets on the other side of the boat. They catch so many fish that there are too many to eat on their own! Ours is a church that hopes to look beyond our own needs to do what Jesus and the disciples did-share our **fish** with the world.

Where every heart experiences. Jesus reminds us in his birth, his ministry, and in his promise of the Holy Spirit, that God is near! Throughout the pages of the gospels, we see people following him to shorelines and meeting him there. Jesus was standing on the shore when he called his first disciples,

About todays' hymns

For the Beauty of the Earth was inspired by a beautiful late spring day when its author, Folliott Sanford Pierpoint, stopped to rest while taking a walk up a hill near his native city of Bath, England, and viewed the panorama before him, with flowers in full bloom and all the earth seemed to rejoice. Pierpoint was a school headmaster and teacher of literature, but after receiving a small inheritance he spent the remainder of his life travelling and writing, resulting in numerous hymns and seven volumes of sacred poems, many of which dealt with his love of nature. This hymn was originally a Communion hymn, intended to infuse a note of joy into an otherwise solemn service.

Now Thank We All Our God was written about 1636 by Martin Rinkart, a pastor in Germany during the Thirty Years' War and also during a plague which ravished his community. Rinkart buried four thousand of the eight thousand in his community who died. He wrote the first two stanzas as a grace to be sung before meals at his family table.

About today's choral music

Everywhere I Go was written and composed by Natalie Sleeth, a leading composer in the latter part of the twentieth century of sacred songs for children.

For the Beauty of the Earth was composed by John Rutter for the Texas Choral Directors' Association in 1980 and is one of his most well known anthems. It is a setting of stanzas from Folliott Sanford Pierpoint's hymn.

A Clare Benediction was composed by Rutter for the Choir of Clare College, Cambridge University. Rutter had a long association with Clare College, having studied there in the 1960's and then returning as director of the chapel choir from 1975-79. He composed this anthem in 1998 in honor of his Alma mater.
