About todays' hymns

Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee was written by Henry van Dyke in 1907 while he was guest preacher at Williams College, in the Berkshires, Williamstown, Massachusetts. About this hymn he wrote, *These verses are simple expressions of common Christian feelings and desires in this present time, - hymns of today that may be sung together by people who know the thought of the age, and are not afraid that any truth of science will destroy religion, or any revolution on earth overthrow the kingdom of heaven. Therefore these are hymns of trust and joy and hope.*

Praise the Lord, God's Glories Show is a metrical paraphrase by Henry Francis Lyte of Psalm 150. Lyte was a Scotsman and was a gifted writer. He had intended to be a physician but was led into the Christian ministry, and served small parishes throughout his ministry.

About today's choral music

Heavenly Light was composed by Alexander Kopylov, an Imperial Russian composer and violinist active during the late nineteenth century and the first decade of the twentieth century. This piece was originally conceived for use at the beginning of evening worship and sung during the lighting of the candles.

Ain'-a That Good News is one of many arrangements of spirituals by William Dawson. Dawson was a major figure in American choral music during the twentieth century, most notably as the director of the Tuskegee Institute Choir in Alabama from 1931-1955, building on the African-American spiritual tradition, a tradition of which he and his forbearers were a part of. In addition to his works for choir, he composed chamber and orchestral music, some of which was premiered by the Philadelphia Orchestra and the New York Philharmonic.

Not One Sparrow Is Forgotten is a hymn from the American Shaker tradition. The Shakers were a religious sect that began in the mid-eighteenth century in England and came to the United States in 1774. The name "Shaker" comes from their worship style, which included moving and singing "in the spirit" which often took the form of a fit of trembling. It was this that mockers were ridiculing by calling the worshippers "Shakers." They are also known for their simple living, architecture, technological innovation, music, and furniture.

Seven pairs of windows vividly illustrate The Lord's Prayer. Because of their smaller size, these windows incorporate very tiny figures to achieve a striking jeweled effect. Rich in Christian meaning and symbolism, the Kirk's stained glass windows are notable works of art that radiate a veritable "gospel in glass" throughout the sanctuary.
