

Here at the Kirk, our vision statement is *We envision a world where every heart experiences God's transforming love.* This statement was born from months of congregation-wide listening sessions and years of prayer and discernment. We are already seeing it take root.

We envision a world. In one of Jesus' most famous moments, he feeds the multitudes with five loaves and two fish. In another story, Jesus helps his frustrated disciples to secure a net full of fish by inviting them to cast their nets on the other side of the boat. They catch so many fish that there are too many to eat on their own! Ours is a church that hopes to look beyond our own needs to do what Jesus and the disciples did—share our fish with the world.

Where every heart experiences. Jesus reminds us in his birth, his ministry, and in his promise of the Holy Spirit, that God is near! Throughout the pages of the gospels, we see people following him to shorelines and meeting him there. Jesus was standing on the shore when he called his first disciples,

Peter and Andrew. The **shore** is where the crowd listened to him preach and where the disciples met him after the resurrection. We hope to be a church that comes to shore to meet the living Christ! For us, this starts in **worship**. We hope through our worship, mission, and formation, we will have your eyes lighting up with the reminder of how you and how our community are made well (created), are being made well (healed), and will be made well (saved) into eternity.

About todays' hymns

God, Reveal Your Presence was written by Gerhard Tersteegen, who lived during the eighteenth century in Westphalia. His parents intended that he become a Reformed minister, but after the death of his father it was financially impossible for him to continue his education. On Maundy Thursday 1724 he wrote out a solemn covenant with God that he signed with his own blood, and thereafter devoted himself to prayer, preaching, visiting the poor, translating the works of medieval mystics, and writing devotional material.

This Is My Father's World was written by Maltbie Davenport Babcock, a late nineteenth century Presbyterian pastor who served as pastor of New York City's Brick Presbyterian Church. The tune is adapted from an English folk song.

About today's choral music

The introit is a setting of a prayer from the Sarum Primer. The Sarum Primer was a prayer book from the late eleventh century. "Sarum" is the ancient name for Salisbury, a major town (now city) in Wiltshire, England. Salisbury Cathedral was widely known and respected for its liturgy in the late Middle Ages, and churches throughout the British Isles and parts of northwestern Europe adapted its customs for celebrations of the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours, referred to as the Sarum Rite. The Sarum Rite has a unique ecumenical position in influencing liturgical practices of the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, and Protestant (especially Anglican) churches.

The Father's Love is a setting of John 15: 9-12. The composer of this setting, Simon Lole, was Director of Music and Organist of Salisbury Cathedral from 1997 to 2005.

Like as a Father is a setting of Psalm 103: 13. The composer, Luigi Cherubini, was an Italian Classical and early Romantic era composer, and is best known for both his sacred music and his contributions to the operatic repertoire. This anthem is constructed as a three-part canon. In music, a canon is a contrapuntal compositional technique that employs a melody with one or more imitations of the melody played after a given duration (e.g., quarter rest, one measure, etc.). The initial melody is called the leader, while the imitative melody, which is played in a different voice, is called the follower.

Rich in Christian meaning and symbolism, the Kirk's stained glass windows are notable works of art that radiate a veritable "gospel in glass" throughout the sanctuary.
