# Welcome to worship. Welcome to the Kirk. Welcome home.

# About today's hymns

What a friend We Have in Jesus, was written by Joseph M. Scriven (1819-1886), an Irish immigrant to Canada in 1855. Scriven's life was filled with grief and trials, and he often sought comfort from the Lord as described in his famous hymn. He experienced the loss of two fiancées and suffered from depression, but he wrote this hymn as a comfort to his mother in Ireland when she was experiencing great sorrow.

**I Want Jesus to Walk with Me** is an African American spiritual, many times used during the journey of the Lenten season. As we sing it today, we pray for and can be assured that Jesus has gone before us in temptation and will walk with us through every time of trial.

**How Firm a Foundation** was published in John Rippon's *A Selection of Hymns* in 1787 and set to American folk melody edited by Joseph Funk. As we sing this today and are sent out into our week, let us be reminded of God's promises to us in Scripture: that God will never leave us, nor forsake us.

# About today's solo and anthem

This famous setting of **The Lord's Prayer** was composed by Albert Hay Malotte (1895-1964) in 1935. Although the prayer had been previously set to music, Malotte's version was the first to reach widespread popularity, and has since been recorded by many renowned artists.

**Sweet Hour of Prayer** was written by a blind English preacher from the small village of Coleshill, Warwickshire. It was published in 1845 and set to music in 1861 by famous American gospel hymn writer, William Bradbury, who is known for other beloved gospel hymns such as "Just As I Am" and "He Leadeth Me". The text of this hymn speaks to the fostering of private prayer, that we share with God in our deepest and loneliest desert places.

Sermon Series Cover Art - The entire life of Christ, brilliantly illustrated in stained glass, surrounds worshippers in the Sanctuary at the Kirk. Seven pairs of windows vividly illustrate The Lord's Prayer. Because of their smaller size, these windows incorporate very tiny figures to achieve a striking jeweled effect. Rich in Christian meaning and symbolism, the Kirk's stained glass windows are notable works of art that radiate a veritable "gospel in glass" throughout the sanctuary.
