

Music Search Committee Update

This past summer, the Session created a committee, headed by Elder Keith Peters and included members: Jeff Haynes, Amy Tully, Jayne Dodge, Julia Libcke, and Meg Lentz. This committee's task was to examine the Music Department and determine what were the important programs, what were the staffing needs, create the appropriate job descriptions for said staffing, determine a search committee and finally assess the complex issues of the organ.

The search committee and job descriptions for a full-time Music Director and part-time Organist were approved by Session in November. Members of the Search Committee include: Anita Pinson, Carol Beth Litkouhi, Jeff Haynes, Jim Tully, and Robert Libcke.

With sage advice from Tom Granum, the committee got to work right away creating a timeline and procedures for the search. In early December the Job Description for the Director of Music Ministries was posted with several professional organizations, Including the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, The American Choral Directors Association, The American Guild of Organists, PCUSA Louisville, as well as over a dozen major music schools.

In only one week, the committee had received almost a dozen applications, showing that this is a highly sought-after position.

Because the committee felt that the new Music Director should have some input into the new organist, it was decided that there should be a delay in posting the position for the organist until into the new year.

Examination of the Chancel Organ is ongoing. Several organ builders have assessed its condition and made recommendation. It is apparent that builder availability, timing, the hiring of a new organist, and funding will all have a huge impact on the organ next steps.

We hope to have the new Director of Music Ministries in place no later than July, with the Organist not far behind. The deadline for application for the Director of Music Ministries is January 31, with interviews in February and March and finally auditions for the select candidates in April and May.

The job description for the Director of Music Ministries can be found on the Kirk in the Hills web site under Resources/Employment. This is an important aspect of rebuilding our church and I am sure that God will have a huge hand in finding the right person to lead our illustrious Music Program. I am looking forward to seeing who that will be.

WORSHIP NOTES

Notes on worship and music

Today's worship incorporates the transitions of the liturgical calendar. We begin with the Second Sunday after Christmas Day with a memory of Christmas morn as we sing the first stanza of *The First Noel*. Within *The First Noel*, we move forward in Christ's life and in our liturgical season as we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, traditionally celebrated on the 12th day of Christmas, January 6. We look to the Bethlehem star for guidance. We are reminded with *We Three Kings of Orient Are* of the three gifts presented to the Christ child, suggesting the number three and perhaps kings or magi. The offertory anthem, *Arise, Shine, for Your Light Has Come*, proclaims Isaiah 60:1, 3, 9. Perhaps a more accurate translation in place of "shine" is "reflect." Have you seen the top of a mountain reflect the sunrise before you saw the sun itself? You might think of this text as "Arise, reflect the Light of Christ. We may not see Christ himself, but we can reflect the light of Christ to the world."

We then move into the life of Christ, which is commonly studied in the weeks following the Epiphany of the Lord, with our hearing the Luke scripture of the boy Jesus in the Temple. Although the hymn title is certainly familiar, our final hymn, Hark! The Herald Angels Sing (Jesus, the Light of the World), may be unfamiliar to many of you. As you read at the bottom of the hymn page: "This blues-tinged setting of a familiar Christmas carol participates in a longstanding African-American practice of adapting Anglo-European texts, as is done here by incorporating a repeated internal line and by appending a refrain that expands that line's language and imagery." Images of light are common to the sequence of Advent-Christmas-Epiphany and into the Sundays after Epiphany, culminating in the light of the Transfiguration, the Sunday before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent, when the great glory of God in the person of Jesus Christ was made clear to Peter, James, and John (Mark9:2-12).
