**Today is a joyful day of ordination and installation of our incoming ruling elders, deacons and trustees at our church.** Congratulations and thank you for hearing the Spirit's call and saying yes to serving the church with energy, intelligence, imagination and love! As our new church officers are ordained and installed today, I wanted to take a minute to explain the roles of each office so that we, as a congregation, can support them better as they faithfully serve Christ and his church. Below are the definitions of each role taken from our denomination's constitution, *The Book of Order*:

# **Ruling Elders**

"As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in

leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the session. When elected as commissioners to higher councils, ruling elders participate and vote with the same authority as ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and they are eligible for any office." (G-2.0301)

## Deacons

"The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry." (G-2.0201)

## Trustees

"The corporation so formed, or the individual trustees, shall have the following powers: to receive, hold, encumber, manage, and transfer property, real or personal, for the congregation, provided that in buying, selling, and mortgaging real property, the trustees shall act only after the approval of the congregation, granted in a duly constituted meeting; to accept and execute deeds of title to such property; to hold and defend title to such property; to manage any permanent special funds for the furtherance of the purposes of the congregation, all subject to the authority of the session and under the provisions of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The powers and duties of the trustees shall not infringe upon the powers and duties of the session or the board of deacons." (G-4.0101)

Newly elected ruling elders and deacons are ordained and installed while our trustees are commissioned and installed. Thank you, our newly ordained/commissioned and installed ruling elders, deacons, and trustees! May we hold them close to our hearts and prayers:

Almighty God, in every age you have chosen servants to speak your word and lead your loyal people. We thank you for these men and women whom you have called to serve you. Give them special gifts to do their special work; and fill them with the Holy Spirit, so they may have the same mind that was in Christ Jesus and be faithful disciples as long as they shall live. Amen.

## Worship/Music Notes

On this day of Ordination and Installation of new officers in the church, we focus on love, laughter, and leadership. As we begin our sermon series "Where God Leads" our worship opens with a prayer, *Lead us, heavenly Father*, for God to lead, guard and keep us through life's trials. A plain chant melody harmonized by William Henry Monk, this ties in with another chant, a Russian orthodox Kyrie. The other service music for this sermon series, are prayers and assurance of God's direction in our lives: the Choral Prayer for Illumination *Lead us to Christ, the living Way* and the Choral Orison *He Leadeth Me.* Today's first hymn (*Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee*) is the famous "Ode to Joy" melody from the final movement of Ludwig van Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. This text of joy and adoration was written in 1907 by Presbyterian pastor and author, Henry Van Dyke, with this tune in mind. As we move to a time of prayer, the choir sings Ned Rorem's *Sing, My Soul, His Wondrous Love*, a lush setting of an 1841 Protestant Episcopal hymn, which includes subtle reharmonizations of the hymn tune that illuminate God's mercy and love to us. We then sing together hymn 805 *Come Sing to God*, praise and thanks for God who has "filled our lives with joy".

Our offertory is the timeless spiritual by William Dawson, *Ain'-a That Good News*. This arrangement captures the true authenticity of the African-American musical heritage, featuring a call and response format that builds into a stirring exclamation of praise and celebration! After our new officers are ordained and installed and we hear the word proclaimed, we close the service in thanks and praise singing hymn 697 *Take My Life*, offering the dedication of our lives in service and gratitude to God for all that which God has blessed us.
