This last weekend, I traveled to Lansing to see the award-winning Broadway show, "Hamilton." The songs have been dancing in my head ever since, but one of my favorite songs is called "The Room Where it Happened." Aaron Burr, the frenemy of Alexander Hamilton, is amazed that his rival somehow got Thomas Jefferson and James Madison together in a room and came up with a compromise, despite their opposing political objectives. As we experience Holy Week and travel alongside Jesus in his final days, we remember that fateful meal in the Upper Room, and maybe we wish we had been in the room with Jesus' closest friends. Thankfully, storytellers were in the room where it happened, and tell us how Jesus sat at the table with his disciples, and gave them hope and unity in the midst of a difficult time. Jesus even included Judas, the one who was going to betray him, in the room where it happened– where grace was extended to all.

I serve The Kirk West community at Fox Run, and I have been so impressed by the amazing flexibility they've shown this season, despite technology and logistical problems. They have partnered with mission agencies and done amazing work, donating clothing and furniture to Oakland Hope, holding paper bags drives for Lighthouse, and engaging in 40 days of Lent at \$1/day and raised \$1380 for Lighthouse. Internationally, they also have come together to donate finances to the Ukrainian refugee crisis.

Kirk West has done all this even though due to construction, they had to worship in two separate locations across the campus at Fox Run. But they are gratefully looking forward to a big homecoming service for April 23 where they can all be together again, in the room where it happens-- where God is worshiped and praised.

This year my hope for all of us at the Kirk is to come together in unity this season and beyond. Despite the difficulties we're facing, I hope we can remember we are impacting the world around us and leaving a legacy for future generations. May our worship be energizing and emboldening this Easter season!

Worship/ Music Notes

As we celebrate Palm Sunday the service is ushered in by the choirs singing *Ingrediente Domino*, the Latin text of the story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We are then led by our children in the Processional of Palms, singing the hymns *All Glory, Laud and Honor* and *Hosanna, Loud Hosanna*! In our time with children, the Junior Girls sing first *Ride On Now, O King*! by Helen Kemp, in which you can hear the sound of the donkey riding along the road to Jerusalem, and the exuberant melody of "Hosanna". Continuing with praise, we will hear from our Sunday School Music class, as they lead us in the song they have been learning, *Lord, I Lift Your Name on High*.

Before and after prayer, we hear *My Song Is Love Unknown*, first as an anthem set by Malcom Archer, sung by the Chancel Choir women and Senior Girls' Choir, and then as a congregational hymn. This vivid and poignant reflection on Christ's Passion is powerful in how it depicts Christ's love shown to us, "the loveless, that we might lovely be." We joy in Christ's love for us, yet feel it wrapped together with the pain of his betrayal, as we cry "Crucify!...and for his death we thirst and cry."

As we give thanks by the giving of our tithes and offerings, the choirs sing *Lift Up Your Heads*, a joyful and vibrant anthem by William Mathias, that encourages us to look and see that Jesus, the King of Glory has come in! After the word proclaimed we are sent out declaring Christ's majesty, and look ahead to his Passion as we sing the hymn Ride on! Ride On in Majesty!
