About today's music

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, as we gather to celebrate our Confirmands, Communion, and Mother's Day, we begin with an exclamation of God's goodness and love surrounding us with Junior Girls singing Hal Hopson's *God's Glory Echoes through the Skies*, based on text from Psalm 19 and 23. The Treble Boys sing a beautiful setting of *Count Your Blessings* by Reginald Morgan, giving thanks for and honoring our moms this Mother's Day, for their continual love and blessings in our lives.

As we sing the opening hymn, For the Beauty of the Earth, we give thanks and raise our "hymn of grateful praise" for all that which God has blessed us. After the Rite of Confirmation and hearing the word proclaimed, we sing the familiar hymn God is Here!, affirming our Confirmands as "our children who find a welcome in the Shepherd's flock and fold," especially as they prepare to take their first Communion after Confirmation. The offertory anthem is a well-loved setting of For the Beauty of the Earth by John Rutter who was inspired by the original use of this hymn for Communion in the High Anglican Church. The original refrain "Christ, our God, to thee we raise; This our sacrifice of praise" was meant to mirror the portrayal of Christ's ultimate sacrifice - just as the host would be lifted during the communion as a token of God's gift to us, a "sacrifice of praise" would be lifted in return.

As we come to the Lord's Table, we see Christ who nourishes and sustains us through the images of "Jesus Christ the Apple Tree," in K. Lee Scott's setting of this 18th century poem. Scott has been recognized, for more than twenty years, as one of America's foremost composers of music for the church, and you can hear the tenderness with which he sets this beautiful text. We celebrate that Christ's healing and peace is open to all in *At This Table*, written by Allen Pote, who, using words by New Zealand's preeminent hymn writer Shirley Erena Murray, composed a simple, moving melody that we'll hear accompanied by Merideth Hite Estevez on oboe, which exemplifies the very essence of communion: "Jesus Christ, be the wine of grace and the bread of peace." After Communion we sing *Here I Am, Lord*, affirming and confirming all of our journeys in saying "yes" to Christ and being part of Christ's Church, as we are called to love God's people and "hold them in our hearts".
