

Worship/Music Notes

On this special day, we celebrate the Ordination of the Kirk's own Tyler Brinks!

We begin with a reminder of the need for Christ to be in everything we do with a 4th century prayer from St. Patrick of Ireland, *Christ Be With Me, put to music arranged by George Guest*. Our opening hymn *How Firm a Foundation* is a hymn that for over two centuries has assured believers of the faithfulness of Christ and the certainty of hope. In this hymn we are assured by the words we sing, the Word we are given, and the Word made flesh, of the steadfastness of God and His unfailing love from generation to generation. Before we enter into a time of prayer, the soloist sings *Spirit of God* by Donald Hustad. This hymn is an intimate, personal prayer for the working of the Holy Spirit, for illumination, for greater holiness in our walk with the Lord, and for the fullness of the Spirit.

We respond to the sermon singing *I'm Gonna Live So God Can Use Me*, an African American spiritual about dedicating oneself to God, despite any challenges we might face. The offertory anthem is a beautiful setting of *Be Thou My Vision* by John Rutter, and the text is one that we can continue to pray throughout our journeys that God would be "first in my heart" and in all our days be "Ruler of all."

After the service of Ordination we gave thanks and sing a song of God's covenant with us, *I*, the Lord of Sea and Sky. In this we hear and answer God's call to love and share God's light with the world, saying "Here I am Lord, I will hold your people in my heart." And as prayer of a blessing for Tyler's ministry to come, we pray, "may you love him and serve him all your days, then in heaven may you see his face."
