Every two years, the PC(USA) holds a national gathering to conduct business and be inspired by the work of God's Spirit across the country. For 2022, General Assembly was conducted as a hybrid model. Each commissioner was assigned to a committee that conducted work in person in Louisville, KY (at the national headquarters). Then, from July 5-9, we all joined together online for plenary presentations and voting.

Any changes to our Constitution still need to come back to the Presbyteries for approval before it is finalized, but here are some of highlighted actions from this Assembly:

- New co-moderators: The Rev. Ruth Santana-Grace and the Rev. Shavon Starling-Louis will be serving the national church for the next two years. The two women conducted the assembly with grace, humor, and unity of friendship.
- Approved an updated policy and education around the PC(USA)'s work on ending gun violence, including an update to the film "Trigger," produced by the Presbyterian Mission Agency.
- Approved a statement declaring the State of Israel to be an apartheid state due to the two sets of laws for Israelis and Palestinians. In the rationale, it explains this is not an indictment on the Jewish people, but a criticism of the governmental policies in place. In another action, the Assembly voted to recommit ourselves to denouncing Anti-semiticism and Islamophobia.
- To include in pastors' terms of call a policy of 12 week family medical leave includes circumstances of giving birth, adoption, and caring for an ill or disabled family member.
- The Rules of Discipline section of the Constitution was rewritten for ease of understanding for nonlegal readers.
- Approved appointing a committee that will work on a new Confession to be considered for inclusion in our Book of Confessions. The most recent Confession that was added was the Belhar Confession. It will take a number of years, but the assembly agreed we should consider what matters to the church "for such a time as this."
- The next assembly will also be hybrid, in a different way. Committee work will be done online, and plenaries will be held in person in Salt Lake City from June 29-July 3, 2024.

It was a privilege to serve the Presbytery as a Commissioner, and my service continues for the next two years to help interpret and act on the priorities of the Assembly.

Worship/Music Notes

On the final Sunday in our Psalms for the Summer Series, we are encouraged to "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord!" as we focus on Psalm 100. In the Garden service, we open with the prelude *A Simple Song*, by Leonard Bernstein. One of the more popular excerpts from his *Mass*, the piece opens with a vibrant open strum from the guitar and an exhortation to "sing God a simple song!" It also quotes Psalm 139, "I will lift up my eyes to the hills," and ends with playful flourish on "laude," the Latin word for "praise," and a confirmation that we will praise the Lord "all of our days."

Our opening song of praise *is How Great Is Our God*, by Chris Tomlin, that gives imagery of the majestic nature of God, and how he is "worthy of all our praise." The soloist sings a joyful setting of the traditional spiritual *You Can Tell the World*, about what Jesus has done, and how "he brought joy to my soul." Our closing hymn is *Make a Joyful Noise to God*! (a setting of Psalm 66), sung to the familiar Dix tune of *For the Beauty of the Earth*, another exhortation to praise and "lift a thankful voice for God's mercies."

In the sanctuary, after the invitation to sing God *A Simple Song*, we open with the exhortation to "*Make A Joyful Noise unto the Lord*" to the tune Singt dem Herren by 16th century German composer Michael Praetorius. We then sing one the best-known traditional settings of Psalm 100, *All People That on Earth Do Dwell*. Before the Prayers of the People, the soloist sings the joyful setting of a traditional spiritual, *You Can Tell the World*, by Margaret Bonds, telling about what Jesus has done, and how "he brought joy to my soul." This is followed by the hymn *We Praise You*, *O God*, a text of thanksgiving and praise amidst life's trials.

The offertory anthem is a setting of Psalm 100 (Jubilate Deo) by Robert N. Roth, a composer and organist who has written numerous compositions for church choirs, as well as contributed to The Hymnal 1982. Our closing hymn is *Make a Joyful Noise to God!* (a setting of Psalm 66), sung to the familiar Dix tune of *For the Beauty of the Earth,* another exhortation to praise with "thankful voice for God's mercies." And as we are sent out into the world to share the love of Jesus, we are reminded that our calling is to "go in joy to spread the Word" and to love and care for our neighbors.
