Kirk in the Hills is planning a pilgrimage of spiritual growth and enrichment to Egypt. We will encounter the religious experiences of the ancient Egyptians and discover the roots of our own Biblical origins. This is a country that saved Jacob's family from starvation, educated Moses, and shielded Jesus from Herod's wrath.

We will have the opportunity to visit the monumental remains of Pharaonic Egypt with its magnificent historical treasures as well as modern Egypt's mosques, squares and the Nile. We will visit the cities of Cairo, Alexandria and Luxor.

We will meet members of the Coptic church, visit some of the oldest mosques and learn what it is like to live as a Christian in a predominantly Muslim country.

Our tour guide is the esteemed Old Testament scholar, Dr. Theodore Hiebert. He has a Ph.D. in Classical Hebrew and Hebrew Scriptures, a M.Div. from Princeton Theological Seminary and a B.A. in English Literature from Fresno Pacific University. WORSHIP NOTES

Worship/Music Notes

Today we come to the water as we look at *Baptism from 20,000 feet* and celebrate the baptism of seven of our young ones. We open with the simple spiritual *Take Me to the Water*, and sing together the beloved hymn *Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing*. Written by a British Baptist pastor, this hymn text uses imagery of Christ as the giver of living water and the shepherd gathering his sheep back into the fold, reminding us of the ever-bountiful grace of God that we receive through baptism.

After the sacrament of baptism, we affirm the meaning of our baptism in singing *Baptized in Water*, a triumphant hymn that succinctly captures our need for salvation, and the promise of freedom we gain in becoming God's children through Christ. And after the Word proclaimed, we continue to wade in the waters of peace, joy and love, singing *I've Got Peace Like a River*.

During the offertory, our soloist sings *At the River*, the fourth song in Aaron Copland's Old American Songs, Volume 2. Based on this morning's text from Revelation 22:1–2, it invites us to gather at the "beautiful river flowing by the throne of God" – where we are made whole, and connected to those "saints" who, like us, have been marked as God's own. It is from this place of belonging and connected-ness that we can *Go to the World*, sharing the good news with those around us and celebrating baptism "as a sign of our rebirth." And as we receive the benediction, we are assured that we are sealed in the baptismal river of God's love, and that he has made us his forever.

The organ's first voluntary is by the famous Belgian organist and composer Flor Peeters. This aria was first intended as a middle movement for a trumpet sonata, but soon became an independent organ piece. The second aria is by Paul Manz, who studied with Dr. Peeters. Manz clearly took inspiration from his mentor, even as his aria explores more modern harmonies and form. The organ postlude, also by Peeters, treats the Trinitarian hymn "Holy God" by placing triplet chordal figures against the cantus firmus (melody) of the hymn.
