

About Marilyn Biery

Marilyn Perkins Biery is an organist, conductor, composer, hymn writer, and keyboard acquisitions editor for Augsburg Fortress of Minneapolis, Minnesota. She has served as music director for several downtown Detroit churches, most recently at Fort Street Presbyterian Church.

Before moving to Michigan with her husband, James Biery, in 2010, Marilyn was Associate Director of Music at the Cathedral of St. Paul in St. Paul, Minnesota. The Bierys also lived in Connecticut, where Marilyn was Director of Music Ministries at First Church of Christ (Center Church) in downtown Hartford.

Marilyn holds Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in organ performance from Northwestern University—she entered the doctoral program in choral conducting at the University of Connecticut before they moved to Minnesota, and she finished her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance from the University of Minnesota (the University of Minnesota didn't offer a doctorate in conducting at the time).

Her hymn texts, choral and organ compositions are published by GIA, MorningStar, Augsburg Fortress, and Concordia. Her organ performances have been broadcast numerous times over the syndicated organ program from Minnesota, Pipedreams.

She and Jim live in Grosse Pointe Farms—Jim is Minister of Music and Organist at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church. Their daughter, Laura, lives in Royal Oak and is a litigation attorney at Honigman in Detroit. The Bierys have a Jack Russell/Dachshund mix dog that they got as a rescue last year. Marilyn loves to cook and bake bread.

Worship/Music Notes

In worship today we are exploring Sabbath, and how rest and work can co-exist on the Sabbath day. We open with a setting of our scripture passage Psalm 127: 1-2, *Unless the Lord the House Shall Build*, recognizing that our human labors are in vain without God's help. Together we sing our opening hymn, *O Day of Rest and Gladness*, a celebration of the Sabbath and the joy that comes in remembering our creation, salvation in Christ, and the Holy Spirit's descending upon us.

We enter into a time of prayer as the choir sings *Come Unto Him,* an arrangement by Lee Dengler that combines two familiar melodies, the folk tune Shenandoah and He Shall Feed His Flock from Handel's "Messiah." This meaningful text by Susan Naus Dengler is a reminder that Christ is with us in our labors and has come to give rest to the weary.

As we prepare to receive the offering, we sing together *God*, *Whose Giving Knows No Ending*, "offering ourselves in praise," asking God to "direct our daily labor" and committing ourselves to "serving [God] by loving all." The offertory anthem is *Hymn for Labor Day*, by Thurlow Weed. This newly composed traditional hymn gives thanks for the gift of work and vocation, and tells us that we do not "labor in vain" because we know that we are doing the work of building God's kingdom, and we return that gift to God "by serving those around us."

After hearing the word proclaimed we sing *How Clear Is Our Vocation, Lord.* In this hymn is illustrated God's promise to sustain and even "refresh" us in our daily work and as we live according to his word. We then go out in joy, knowing that our daily work is to love our neighbor with God's grace to empower us!
