

# Help Us Fight World Hunger!

CROP Hunger Walks are community-based walk fundraising events held across the United States to support the global mission of Church World Service, a faith-based organization transforming communities around the globe through responses to hunger, poverty, displacement, and disaster. 75% of the funds raised are send globally and 25% are returned to the host community to support local hunger-fighting efforts.

#### SHARING IN THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

### Worship/Music Notes

Today's organ voluntary is a joyful dance-fugue by Dietrich Buxtehude (c. 1637-1707), a Danish/German organist who was a substantial influence on J.S. Bach. The instrumental voluntary was long attributed to J.S. Bach and is now believed to have been written by his son, Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach (1714–1788). (Merideth Estevez is the oboist.) The Chancel Choir is back from their summer schedule, and they sing two anthems today: the familiar "With a Voice of Singing" by the English composer Martin Shaw (1875-1958) that dates to 1923 and has been a staple of church choirs for decades, and "The Peace of Christ" by James Biery with words by Marilyn Biery.
