

After the worship service, everyone will be invited to a festive brunch in the Refectory.

He served for many years as Organist/Choirmaster for the First Presbyterian Church in Detroit (which now houses the Ecumenical Theological Seminary); his ashes are interred at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church.
