

As we celebrate World Communion Sunday with Christians all over the world, the Chancel Choir sings two anthems based on Psalm 117: "Praise the Lord, all you nations! Extol him, all you peoples! For great is his steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever." (NRSV) The anthem during the offertory was composed for the choir of the First Presbyterian Church in Durham, North Carolina for World Communion Sunday, 2018, and is a triumphant setting of the Psalm text. The anthem during communion is a meditative setting of the same text, from Mozart's *Vesperae solennes de confessore*, K. 339, and will be sung in the original Latin. The opening voluntary from the Concerto for Oboe by Adam Ignaz Franz Joseph Malzat (1757–1804), was previously attributed to Franz Joseph Haydn (1732–1809).

Marilyn holds a B.A. in Classical Studies from Calvin College (Grand Rapids, MI), an M.A. in Art History from Michigan State University, and an M.A. in Theology from St. Thomas University (Houston). She has participated in four archeological digs in Jordan and Egypt and taught as adjunct faculty at the University of Houston for 20 years. She is ordained as an elder and has been married to Mark Borst for 43 years. The Borsts reside in Savannah, GA, where they are endlessly entertained by the antics of their precocious cat, Cleopatra.
