It has always brought me joy to know that a house sits in the center of our campus. If you look at the Kirk from Long Lake Road, you can see it nestled in there. On one side of the house sits the sanctuary and tower - a sanctuary built in the way of

Scotland's Melrose Abbey and a tower that houses

an instrument boasting the most bells of any carillon in the world. The Abbey sits on the other side of the house. With classrooms, meeting space, a preschool, and Refectory, the Abbey was born from a fundraising campaign called "The Second Mile" led by faithful Kirk members in the early sixties.

But there, in the center, sits the house. It was donated by a man named Colonel George who had a dream that it would be, as he put it, "a temple worthy to be called the house of God." For seventy-five years now, George's dream has been our endeavor. Beyond the sanctuary, tower, and Abbey, the members of Kirk in the Hills have established endowments, completed renovations, secured art, designed lectureships, and created mission programs like Kirk Tutors and Accent Pontiac. Colonel George gave the house, but we have made it a home for all, and God has made a home in us.

As we embark on our 75th Anniversary Campaign alongside our annual giving campaign, we do so to press on as Emerson suggests - with love and dreams - in hopes to further make the house a home. With a successful effort, our church home will have what the fine old hymn, "Great is Thy Faithfulness" suggests: "strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow."

When Colonel George first presented his house to the work of the Presbyterian church, he said, "To give unto God material wealth that belonged to him in the first place, is minor to the giving of one's life in unselfish devotion, ministering in God's name and expounding Christ's gospel of love."

We are blessed to look back and be inspired by the generosity of the generations that came before us. I hope that when future members look back, maybe at the 100th anniversary, they will say the same of us. There is no limit to what we can achieve - if we all come together. Let us ensure that Kirk in the Hills will always continue to be more than a house, but a place where all that search for Christ's gospel of love will hear and experience the words, "Welcome Home."

RESTORING OUR ORGAN FOR TOMORROW

Our organ serves as the primary instrument of worship and helps to support our 20-member Chancel Choir, our boys' and girls' choirs, and over 50 children and youth in our musical program. Each year general funds are dedicated to the tuning and upkeep of the organ

with endowed funds being allocated for special performances and guest musicians. While helpful in maintaining the current organ, a major restoration is needed to ensure that we will have a quality instrument for years to come. As a part of this Anniversary Campaign, we will be making an investment towards a portion of the repairs needed to restore the organ.









SUPPORTING OUR STAFF FOR TODAY

The Kirk has a vibrant community of faith, one that is shaped and guided by our pastoral leaders. Our pastors help to care for all of our families through every stage of life including our greatest celebrations of births, baptisms, and weddings as well as our moments of loss and grief. A large portion of our Annual Giving goes towards ensuring fair compensation for our leaders.

ENSURING STRONG LEADERSHIP FOR TOMORROW

For nearly 75 years, the Kirk has been blessed with incredibly strong and visionary leaders who have helped to shape the spiritual foundation and formation of our congregation. As we look ahead, the Kirk remains ever-committed to engaging in spirit-led worship and transforming lives for Christ. Through the Anniversary Campaign, a seed investment will be provided to establish a new endowment fund to help support our pastoral leaders.

By establishing a Pastoral Endowment Fund, we can help cover the annual compensation of our pastors for years to come and free up annual dollars to be reallocated towards ministry and missions. While this initial investment will not be enough to cover all the annual compensation of our pastors, we intend to grow this fund over the next 10-25 years to fully cover our pastors' remunerations in perpetuity.

MISSION-DRIVEN IMPACT

Our active partnerships with Accent Pontiac, Kirk Tutors, Lighthouse, South Oakland Shelter (SOS), foster care agencies and many others, have allowed us to successfully address issues such as food insecurity, housing, education, clothing, and furniture each and every year. Because we believe our Kirk family extends well beyond our four walls, we are committed to bettering the lives of families in our greater community every single day.

EXTENDING HOSPITALITY FOR TOMORROW

Kirk in the Hills has built a foundation of strong relationships in Pontiac. Now, let's build a house for pilgrimage and innovative mission. Imagine a space where Kirk volunteers can gather for workshops, sort through food and clothing donations, and for youth groups to come and serve throughout the year. Based on the Pittsburgh Project and The Center in Baltimore, this new space would serve as a mission hub for many different programs and visiting service teams. By establishing a physical footprint in Pontiac, we hope to strengthen our commitment to the flourishing of this city for many years to come.

We envision the opportunity to house volunteers such as pastoral residents, local and international summer interns, and AmeriCorps volunteers for extended periods of time to serve Pontiac. Through their dedicated presence, we will be able to provide intentional outreach and support to children and families in our community.

WELCOME

We will welcome our neighbors with Christian hospitality through food, shelter, clothing, and more. This building can be used as a warming shelter in the colder months and provide a sorting space for food, clothing, and furniture collected by Kirk members. All efforts will be made in collaboration with our local mission partners.



EQUIP

The Kirk House would primarily serve as an equipping space for youth groups from across the nation to learn about our work in Pontiac and to serve alongside us and our ministry partners. In addition, this multipurpose space will host mission conferences, church retreats, and community-wide workshops.


CREATING A WELCOMING CAMPUS FOR TOMORROW

YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS



Here at the Kirk, we recognize the importance of prioritizing the formation of our youth and young adults. In partnership with Princeton Theological Seminary, the Kirk will serve as one of five "hubs" around the country to foster innovative and sustainable youth ministries. In addition, funds will be dedicated to building our relationship with Alma College by supporting their ongoing initiatives to grow the faith of our young adults.



PRAYER PATH: PHASE I



The prayer path will offer a space for individuals and families to walk, run, and push their strollers. Along the way, the path will incorporate intentional points of spiritual reflection, rest, and recreation. As the first phase of a multi-part project, this walkway is anticipated to stretch a mile long around the outermost edge of the Kirk campus.



TERRACE REPAIR & OUTDOOR WORSHIP CENTER



At present, the Refectory terrace is roped off and unsafe to use. We want to make sure our spaces are safe and secure for worship and other community-building experiences. To do so, we will be fully repairing the terrace as well as considering our options on how to provide a dedicated outdoor space to host weddings, outdoor summer worship services, Vacation Bible School, church picnics, youth group gatherings, and more.

CARING FOR OUR FACILITY

PRESERVING OUR FACILITY FOR TODAY

Each year, we are incredibly grateful to the numerous hands that play a role in keeping our campus beautiful and safe throughout the year. While the current endowment helps to cover the majority of ongoing property expenses such as maintenance, repairs, and groundwork, annual dollars are dedicated to supporting our sexton staff. This staff sets up for weekly worship and meetings as well as cares for the day-to-day custodial needs of the church. In addition, funds are allocated to ensuring the safety of the building throughout all seasons through snow removal, salting of the sidewalks, and the placement of security guards.

KEEPING OUR CAMPUS SAFE FOR TOMORROW

The Kirk is blessed to be home to a vibrant congregation, an excellent preschool, and weekly ministry groups. In addition, our facility holds several renowned pieces of art and artifacts. To ensure the security of these items and the safety of those on campus, a comprehensive security system will be installed throughout the building.

This security system will include the installation of cameras both inside and outside the building and will allow for increased communication throughout the campus. Security and safety of our staff, families, and visitors is a priority for us as we continue to expand our ministries.


ENHANCING OUR COLUMBARIUM FOR TOMORROW
