Guidelines for officer nominations:

Elders – The Presbyterian Church USA's Book of Order (Part II 2019/2023) cites a Ruling Elder Defined (G-2.0301) as follows: "... of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church..."

The Session is the governing body of the congregation. It consists of 15 Ruling Elders who serve for a three-year term and one Youth Ruling Elders who serves a one-year term.

Deacons – Deacons undertake ministries of care and compassion within and beyond the congregation. The Presbyterian Church USA's Book of Order (Part II 2019/2023) cites a Deacon Defined (G-2.0201) as follows: "The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture e is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosenfor this ministry"

The Board of Deacons comprises 24 members who serve for a three-year term and two Youth Deacons who serve a one-year term.

Trustees – Trustees have major responsibilities in the areas of budget and finance, endowments and investments, property maintenance and insurance, personnel and legal affairs. Trustees shall be members of the church who demonstrate qualities of honesty and integrity, energy and business acumen, incorporating both Christian dedication and responsibility. The Presbyterian Church USA's Book of Order (Part II 2019/2023) cites a Deacon Defined (G-4.101) as follows: "The corporation so formed, or the individual trustees, shall have the following powers: to receive, hold, encumber, manage, and transfer property, real or personal, for the congregation, provided that in buying, selling, and mortgaging real property, the trustees shall act only after the approval of the congregation, granted in a duly constituted meeting; to accept and execute deeds of title to such property; to hold and defend title to such property; to manage any permanent special funds for the furtherance of the purposes of the congregation, all subject to the authority of the session and under the provisions of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The powers and duties of the trustees shall not infringe upon the powers and duties of the session or the board of deacons."

Kirk in the Hills has a board of 18 trustees, elected for a three-year term.

Church Officer Nominating Committee Members-at-Large – Three individuals elected from church-wide membership to serve on the Church Officer Nominating Committee for a one-year term. The Church Officer Nominating Committee may receive more suggestions than there are available positions. It is the Committee's hope that the congregation will submit names for consideration. Members should understand that, inevitably, many fine suggestions may not lead to nomination or appointment.
