## Local Mission A Closer Look at 2021

#### **Accent Pontiac**

Accent Pontiac provides free during and after school programming to over 250 students at Walt Whitman Elementary School and Alcott Elementary School, resulting in life skills such as leadership, confidence, teamwork and focus. As a result of the funds donated by Kirk in the Hills and other benevolent partners, Accent Pontiac's social change through music program has been able to thrive and grow in 2021, successfully implementing safe and innovative programming throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and expanding programming to serve students at Pontiac Middle School and Herrington Elementary School in Pontiac.



#### Foster Care & Camp Skyline

Kirk in the Hills has an active program serving local youth in southeast Michigan who are in foster care. In 2021, 14 foster care children and youth were supported to attend Camp Skyline for a week's overnight camping experience. Support was provided by paying for each foster child's camp fee and by providing them a duffel bag with camping supplies which included a sleeping bag, toiletries, bath and beach towel, and all the other items needed for their camping experience. These foster care children and youth would not have had this opportunity to go to camp without the support of the Kirk Outreach and Mission. In addition, 20 older and aging out foster care youth were provided tote bag care packages of hygiene items in the spring 2021, and another 20 older aging out youth were provided Holiday Care Packages of socks, hats, gloves, Christmas lights, fleece blankets, notebooks and pens in a reusable tote bag in December 2021. Also 10 school back packs were provided for foster care children in September and cleaning supplies for an aging out youth living in his own apartment.



#### Kirk Tutors

Kirk Tutors have been working with and mentoring Pontiac Elementary School students for approximately 25 years. This twice a week, one-on-one assistance has positively impacted both students and tutors. Tutors provide help with homework, math, reading, journal writing and overall literacy. Students gain self-confidence by writing sentences based on the word of the week and then reading aloud to the group. Christ's love shines bright every time a student's individualized tutor comes in to work with them. They feel special and know that someone cares about them. Many only receive individual attention from an adult when they are in trouble. One of our goals is to provide them with a positive, encouraging environment that offers individual support and attention. Throughout the year we have special celebrations, parties and activities. We celebrate Christmas with gifts, pizza, jello jigglers, cookies and many games of BINGO. At the end of every school year, we celebrate with certificates of accomplishment, more pizza, fruit and BINGO (they love playing this game).









#### Ministry With Pontiac

2021 was a challenging year as we were not able to be with our Whitman students and staff for much of the year due to Covid fully and/or partially closing schools. Even when the school was partially open, visitors were not allowed in to help prevent any spread of the virus. However, the Kirk's Ministry With Pontiac still provided support to Whitman Elementary School. Here are some of the offerings:

- attendance incentives (gift cards & pizza celebrations) to encourage students to be in school and online
- warm, handmade/knitted hats for winter made especially for the kids by our Kirk knitters
- backpacks filled with school supplies packed by the Kirk congregation and passed out to families at a drive-through at Whitman Elementary
- teacher and staff appreciation throughout the year individual cookies in the shapes of school supplies, cupcakes and gift cards
- Parade Company field trip
- Basketball Jones presentation on character, anti-bullying and kindness for all grade levels
- Participation in the Pontiac Trunk or Treat, a safe Halloween event put on by the Pontiac Education Coalition and sponsored by the Oakland County Sheriff. 4-5,000 children and parents safely trick or treat from 100 candy-filled, decorated vehicles, including many provided by Kirk members, in this fun family night in Pontiac.
- A professional development day hosted at the Kirk for the Whitman teachers. This year's speaker was specifically brought in to cover how best to teach students affected by trauma. Our speaker wrote several books, one of which was used as a study guide for the teachers at the Whitman Principal's monthly Teaching Institute.

Ministry With Pontiac (MWP) has been supporting elementary schools in Pontiac for over 15 years. Past years have included the purchase of hundreds of uniforms, socks, underwear, warm coats, boots, shoes, gloves, books and many field trips to the DIA, African American Museum, Science Museum, Underground Railroad Museum, Oakland University, Meadowbrook Theater and in school presentations about Martin Luther King Jr., Abraham Lincoln, Science & Technology, Movie Night, Detroit Opera and Upland Hills Farm. These are programs that the students would not have had without your support so THANK YOU Kirk in the Hills. We look forward to many more years of sharing God's love with His children in Pontiac.





#### Hope Against Trafficking

Hope Against Trafficking is a Pontiac-based free two-year residential program for survivors of human trafficking, providing shelter, education, therapy and the love of Jesus Christ through a family focused ministry. In 2021, Hope Against Trafficking welcomed 3 new residents into the program and hired 3 new staff members. **Church World Services CROP Walk for Hunger** 

Kirk in the Hills, in partnership with five other area churches, raises money annually to help Church World Services address hunger scarcity worldwide. Funds raised in 2021 also supported earthquakeravaged Haiti. Six local agencies, including Lighthouse, Baldwin Center, and Grace Centers of Hope, each received \$1,000. In 2021, the Birmingham/Bloomfield area CROP walk raised more than \$31,200 and came in 44<sup>th</sup> out of the top 100 U.S. CROP Walks, collectively known as the Cream of the Crop. Individually, Kirk in the Hills raised \$15,000 of that total and was ranked the eleventh highest fundraising church in the nation.

#### A Closer Look at 2021

#### Koinonia Ministries - Belize

Kirk in the Hills Outreach and Mission has been in partnership with Koinonia Ministries in Orange Walk, Belize since 2014 to "change Central America, one child at a time." When Kirk adults and youth arrived in Belize in 2014, the small congregation was worshiping under a tarp in a dirt driveway. Kirk youth helped to construct a church building that has over 100 worshipping members and a vibrant youth group (imagined and inspired by the Kirk's own youth group) that is actively involved in mission and outreach to families and churches throughout Central America.

In 2021, Koinonia Ministries was able to serve in the following ways thanks to the Kirk's generous partnership:

- ·Koinonia started a daycare feeding program for 35 children whose parents lost their jobs due to the pandemic.
- ·Koinonia received a thank offering grant from the Presbyterian Women's Foundation to finish and equip its daycare building and kitchen and establish a running well.
- ·Koinonia was offered to broadcast its children's programming on national Belizean television in English and Spanish FREE OF CHARGE starting on 6/5/21 because no other church in the country of Belize was offering children's Christian programming for television or social media.
- ·Koinonia offered online Christian formation training for churches throughout Central America from Mexico to Panama.
- ·Koinonia held a Christmas celebration and provided presents for 60 low-income children in Orange Walk, Belize.
- ·Koinonia also held a Christmas celebration and provided presents for another 60 inter-city children in Southside Belize City.
- ·Koinonia assisted local families with Christmas hampers and groceries.
- ·Koinonia supported pastoral families in El Salvador and Nicaragua.





#### Seki Women's Foundation – South Africa

Kirk in the Hills Outreach and Mission partnered with Seki Women's Foundation in Port Elizabeth, South Africa. Through the generous benevolent giving from the Kirk, Seki was able to provide:


- ·warm meals 3 days a week to 150 children and 300 adults

#### Faith Leaders Breakfast May 31, 2021

On May 31, 2021, Kirk in the Hills hosted 40 faith leaders, business owners and representatives of local community organizations in Oakland County to discuss the needs in our community and ways to collaborate and build upon successful programs focused on serving our neighbors. Ideas and initiatives were shared and the enthusiasm was palpable. The gathering laid the foundation for many new connections in the local community, particularly focused on Pontiac and many of the participants returned on October 1, 2021 to continue conversation and momentum around service at the Pontiac Mission Collaborators Conference.



# Pontiac Mission Collaborators Conference October 1, 2021

On October 1, 2021, Kirk in the Hills Presbyterian Church hosted the Pontiac Mission Collaborators Conference at the Flagstar Strand Theatre in Pontiac. Two hundred people were in attendance to hear presentations by Dr. Samino Scott of the Pontiac Collective Impact Partnership and Becca Stevens, the President and Founder of Thistle Farms in Nashville. Working breakout sessions were facilitated by OCEAN Programs of Cincinnati to address challenges facing the Pontiac community. Several local sponsors contributed nearly \$60,000 toward the costs of the gathering and to offer funding for innovative and collaborative solutions that originated from the conference.

As an outgrowth of the Mission Conference, the following projects will be funded and/or supported through a coaching cohort in partnership with OCEAN Programs to:

- 1) Establish a history/cultural storybook walking trail in an accessible community space.
- 2) Assist returning citizens with employment transportation funds.
- 3) Build an Integrated Educational Training Program that combines English Language Learners and a Certified Nursing Assistant training program.
- 4) Create a collaborative fashion industry experience in Pontiac that will cultivate entrepreneurship.
- 5) Capture collective and collaborative efforts among corporations, civic entities, churches, and nonprofit organizations to initiate and operate a social enterprise and improve and increase human services.
- 6) Launch a pilot to put five (5) new programs online and connect them together with the recipients of past support to form a data base and streamline human resource triage.
- 7) Provide paid training experience for people facing barriers to living wage employment and for the employees' children to be nurtured holistically through childcare and aftercare programs.
- 8) Fund therapeutic and case management services to assist survivors of sexual violence.
- 9) Train and Educate Pontiac Youth in resilience by addressing areas of trauma/adverse learning experiences, raising awareness, and offering resources.
